## Application Form: Dual Degree in Music and Education

The Dual Degree in Music and Education offers eligible students the opportunity to earn a Bachelor of Education, Secondary degree alongside the Bachelor of Music in five years. Successful students will graduate with both degrees at the same time and will be recommended for a Professional Teaching Certificate.

The deadline for applications is January 31, but students are encouraged to apply early and, in particular, to meet with an Education Academic Advisor before applying to the program. To be eligible, students must meet these criteria:

- enrolled in BMUS Year 2 or 3 at the time of application
- EDCP 210 and the Writing Requirement (WRDS 150 or ENGL 100) have been completed successfully
- satisfactory progress through Years 1 and 2 of the curriculum (as outlined on page 2)
- minimum 65\% GPA in Year 1, and also in Year 2. Initial admission is conditional upon achieving this academic level at the end of the current Winter Session.

As noted on page 2, it is recommended that ENGL 110 (or another English course from the BMUS Literature Requirement list) be in progress by the time of application.

Please note that course scheduling is very tight in Years 3-4, so if you are missing any courses from Years 1-2 at the time of application then you may require a 6th year. If you have fallen behind in any part of the curriculum, then you should discuss this issue with Academic Advisors in both Music and Education at the time of application.

Students in the Bachelor of Education program (including Dual Degree students) must participate in school experience placements coordinated by the Teacher Education Office.

Applicants must complete this application form (both pages) and submit it along with an essay specified by the Teacher Education Program as follows:
(500 words) Describe the importance of education in today's world and the role of the teacher in helping young people achieve success in school.

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[^0]:    ${ }^{1}$ The Writing Requirement (WRDS 150 or ENGL 100) must be attempted within the first 30 credits of the program and must be completed successfully within the first 60 credits.
    ${ }^{2}$ This course satisfies the BMUS Literature Requirement. Any English (ENGL) course from the Literature Requirement list may substitute for ENGL 110. Together, ENGL 110 and the Writing Requirement provide the 6 credits of English literature and composition that are required for teacher certification in $B C$.
    ${ }^{3}$ EDUC 452B (Final Inquiry III): a course section for Dual Degree students is scheduled for last week of April and first week of May. EDUC 430 (Community Based Experience) may be integrated with this specially designated course. Alternatively, dual degree students have the option of taking EDUC 430 and EDUC 452B as normally scheduled in Winter Term 2 and Summer Term 2 respectively, as per the 12 -month BED schedule.
